Definitions

- Leavers Those students who do not persist at the institution; but leave.
- Retention (used interchangeably with leavers) can be defined as a measure of institutional effectiveness (Niba and Norman, 1989) and references the rates at which students are retained in the institution and move with their cohorts to graduation.
- Persistence Percentage of first time freshmen completing degrees/certifications on time
