(1) Timeline

- First Seventh-day Adventist missionary to the Far East: Abram La Rue, who arrived in Hong Kong on May 3, 1888
- First missionary to Japan: William C. Grainger, arrived November 1896
- First ordained minister to work in China (Hong Kong): J. N. Anderson, Feb. 1902
- First missionaries to Mainland China: Edwin H. Wilbur & his wife, Dec. 1902
- First missionaries sent to Southeast Asia: Ralph W. Munson & wife, arrived in Padang, on Sumatra, Jan. 1900
- First missionary to the Philippines: R. A. Caldwell, arrived in 1905
- 1903-11: Southeast Asia is under the Australasian Union Conference
- 1909: the Asiatic Division Mission formed—the first division
- 1919: Asiatic Division reorganized and renamed, Far East Division (FED)
- 1931: China Division formed; rest of East & Southeast Asia remains in FED
- 1949: China Division becomes defunct
- 1950: South China Island Union Mission placed with Far East Division
- 1986: Bangladesh, Burma & Sri Lanka transferred from Southern Asia Division to FED
- 1995: FED becomes Asia-Pacific Division
- 1997: Northern Asia-Pacific Division and Southern Asia-Pacific Division separated out of the older territory of FED
